

## **German Ice Report - No. 67**

There is thin ice and new ice formation in sheltered water in the eastern part of the German Baltic coast.

### **North Sea**

In the Northfrisian Wadden Sea there is very open new ice at Eiderdamm.

### **Western Baltic Sea**

Open water with new ice on the inner Schlei, open new ice in the port of Heilgenhafen and very close new ice in the port of Neustadt. At Rostock on the inner port and on Unterwarnow very close new ice in places, further out open water in the sea ports. In the Bodden waters south of Darß and Zingst there is very close to compact thin ice.

### **Southern Baltic Sea**

In the northern approach to Stralsund and east of Hiddensee there is 5-10cm thick fast ice in sheltered areas, else new ice and open to compact, in places up to 15cm thick ice. In the eastern approach to Stralsund there is 5-10cm thick compact ice, from Stralsund port to Palmer Ort. Stripes of 5-10cm close ice or shuga are drifting in the Greifswalder Bodden and there is 5-10cm thick very close ice along the coast, in the Dänische Wiek also up to 16cm thick, rafted very close ice. On the Pennestrom there is mostly very close to compact new ice out to Peenemünde. In the Kleines Haff there is open to very close, up to 10cm thick ice. At the shore north of Thiessow, where the Greifswalder Bodden goes into the Pomeranian Bay there is close, 5-10cm thick ice.

### **Outlook**

New ice formation will continue for at least two days.

### **Restrictions to navigation**

To Stralsund, Wolgast and the harbours in the Greifswalder Bodden only daytime navigation with pilot is allowed.
