

German Ice Report - No. 87
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There are only some ice remnants in the Bodden waters of the coast of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

Western Baltic Sea

In the Bodden waters south of Darß and Zingst there is rotten ice, in places.

Southern Baltic Sea

In the northern approach to Stralsund and east of Hiddensee there is thin rotten ice in sheltered bays. In the Greifswalder Bodden there are ice remnants, mostly at the northeastern shore, and some rotten ice at the eastern shore of the Dänische Wiek, else ice-free. In the Kleines Haff there is close, partly rafted, 5-10 cm thick, rotting ice along the northeastern shore, else ice-free.

Outlook

At air temperatures above 0°C at night and up to 12 °C by day, the remnants of ice will melt rapidly. Single floes of rotten ice may drift in the Greifswalder Bodden and in Kleines Haff within the next week.

Restrictions to navigation

To Stralsund, Wolgast and the harbours in the Greifswalder Bodden only daytime navigation.
