Very close to compact ice is still present in the northern parts of the Bight of Greifswald and of Kleines Haff.

### **Western Baltic Sea**

The bodden waters south of Darß and Zingst are mostly ice-free.

### **Southern Baltic Sea**

The bodden waters between Hiddensee and Rügen are mostly ice-free, but some rotten ice is present in sheltered regions. In the port of Stralsund and farther out on the fairway to Palmer Ort there is open water. In the Bight of Greifswald there is very close to close, partly ridged, 5-15 cm thick ice in the northernmost area. The Peenestrom is ice-free, but very close and up to 8 cm thick, rotten ice is present in Achterwasser. In Kleines Haff there is compact, partly ridged, about 10 cm thick ice in the north and open water in the south.

### **Outlook**

Ice remnants in the eastern coastal waters will melt within the next few days.

### **Restrictions to navigation**

Only daytime navigation is recommended in the eastern approach to Stralsund, in the Bight of Greifswald, and on the northern Peenestrom. Begin and end of daytime navigation can be obtained on VHF or by phone: Warnemünde traffic centre, Stralsund traffic channel 67 or by phone +4938120671843 and Wolgast traffic channel 09 or by phone +4938120671844.

From 30.01.2014: Northern approach to Stralsund (including bodden waters west), inner bodden waters of Rügen, southern Peenestrom and Kleines Haff are closed to navigation.
